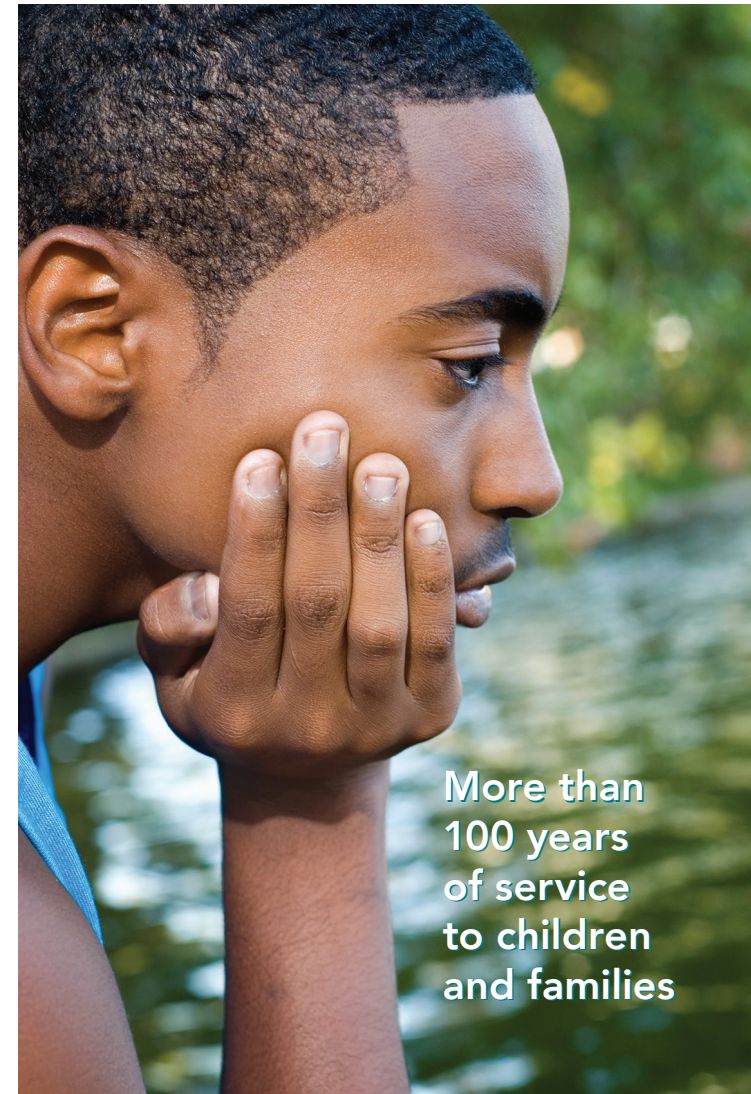

How Vera Lloyd Cares for Children and Families in Crisis

Vera Lloyd Presbyterian Family Services shares healing love with children, youth and families in crisis through comprehensive services at our children's home in Monticello.

Annie B. Wells Campus

Close to 200 children and youth from every region of the state live at our children's home each year because of abandonment, abuse or neglect or because they are returning home after spending time in the juvenile justice system.

We care for youth by providing:

- Emergency shelter for up to 45 days
- Residential care
- Therapeutic group homes for up to nine months
- Respite care for youth in foster care

In our care, vulnerable young people find shelter, security, nutritious meals, a stable atmosphere, an opportunity to excel academically and a chance for success.

They benefit from instruction in independent living skills, professional counseling, medical care and involvement in academic and extracurricular activities. For many youth, their time at Vera Lloyd is the most stable family environment they have ever experienced.

Vera Lloyd relies on philanthropic gifts to care for children and families. It costs \$7,210 a day for Vera Lloyd to care for 42 youth. State contracts cover only 56% of the actual costs of caring for children. Your gifts provide superior care for children and youth.
